Announcement for KMIDS Academic Scholarships Academic Year 2024-2025

Academic Scholarship and Scholarship Tiers

KMIDS Academic Scholarships are annually awarded to our new students who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their previous academic performance and who have the potential to make significant contributions to the enrichment of KMIDS and ultimately to King Mongkut's Institute of Technology Ladkrabang.

KMIDS offers up to **EIGHT scholarships** to outstanding applicants who are new students in Grade 6 - 10 enrolling in the academic year 2023. To be eligible for consideration, these students must demonstrate that they are inquisitive thinkers with a thirst for knowledge. These selected individuals are also expected to be leaders among their peers and possess the ability to inspire others in the student community to achieve the same level of academic excellence.

Five scholarships are offered to middle school students (Grade 6 - 8), and three scholarships are offered to high school students (Grade 9 - 10). Each successful candidate who meets the eligibility criteria and passes the scholarship selection process will be announced formally, and awards will be issued by check payable to the student(s) on the school Founding Day in August of each year (or during a school event that will be held during the first semester). **The decision made by the school's scholarship committee on scholarship awards is final.**

KMIDS offers three tiers of scholarships in recognition of the outstanding performance of students who qualify within each level:

Middle School (Five Scholarships)	High School (Three Scholarships)
Two KMITL Chancellor's Scholarships 180,000 baht	One KMITL Chancellor's Scholarship 190,000 baht
Two KMITL President's Scholarships 140,000 baht	One KMITL President's Scholarship 150,000 baht
One KMIDS Director's Scholarship 90,000 baht	One KMIDS Director's Scholarship 100,000 baht

Required qualifications for Academic Scholarship Applicants

- The applicants must be new students in Grade 6 - 10 who have passed the admission process including examinations (MAP tests, Essay writing and interview) and completed their enrollment process and payments of the school tuition fee and other fees related to the academic year of 2023.
- The applicants eligible to apply for the scholarships must have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their previous academic performance (The students must provide evidence as stated in the Document Submission for each grade).

- Successful applicants who receive KMIDS Academic Scholarships are not eligible to apply for Special Talent Scholarships.
- The students who have passed the admission process and entered the school in the midyear are not eligible to apply for both Academic Scholarships and Special Talent Scholarships.
- The applicants must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.80 or above from their previous school (consecutive five terms).
- The applicants must hold a gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).

Document submission for each grade

Applicants who are eligible to apply for scholarships must write their intention to the KMIDS admission staff and enclose the following documents:

- A copy of the student's national ID card or passport.
- A copy of the household registration (Thai citizen's only).
- A copy of the transcripts which show the student's cumulative GPA.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community services.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).

Middle School

Grade Six

- Transcripts of Prathom three, four and five (First semester) or equivalent from an overseas or international school.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community service.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers at their current school (Using forms provided by KMIDS).
- Statement of purpose outlining how the student can contribute to KMIDS (including details of any previous achievement in school or through external organizations).

Grade Seven

- Transcripts of Prathom four, five and Prathom six (First semester) or equivalent from an overseas or international school.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community services.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers at their current school (Using forms provided by KMIDS).
- Statement of purpose outlining how the student can contribute to KMIDS (including details of any previous achievement in school or through external organizations).

Grade Eight

- Transcripts of Prathom five, six and Matthayom one (First semester) or equivalent from an overseas or international school.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community services.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers at their current school (Using forms provided by KMIDS).
- Statement of purpose outlining how the student can contribute to KMIDS (including details of any previous achievement in school or through external organizations).

High School

Grade Nine

- Transcripts of Pratham six, Matthayom one and Matthayom two (First semester) or equivalent from an overseas or international school.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community services.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers at their current school (Using forms provided by KMIDS).
- Statement of purpose outlining how the student can contribute to KMIDS (including details of any previous achievement in school or through external organizations).

Grade Ten

- Transcripts of Matthayom one, two and Matthayom three (First semester) or equivalent from an overseas or international school.
- A student portfolio highlighting student strengths and community services.
- Gold, silver, or bronze medal, or an equivalent achievement award, from an academic competition (national or international level).
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers at their current school (Using forms provided by KMIDS).
- Statement of purpose outlining how the student can contribute to KMIDS (Including details of any previous achievement in school or through external organizations).

Due date for document submission

The applicants must submit all documents by **Monday, 29th April, 2024.**

Scholarship Assessment Process:

- 1) When the results of Admission Examination of KMIDS are announced, the name list of the successful applicants from Admission along with their documents and portfolios are handed to the committee of Scholarship for judgement.
 - 2) The criteria will be set for selecting the qualified applicants. KMIDS reserves the right to restrict or change the criteria without advance notice.
 - 3) There will be meetings and panel discussions of the committee to screen and select those qualified applicants.
 - 4) Once the committee has selected the most qualified, the name list of successful will be handed to the leadership management team for approval.
 - 5) The name list of successful applicants will be announced and awarded on the Founding Day of school (or in the formal events held in school).
- Please note that the candidates must pass KMIDS admission process which includes examinations of MAP (Reading and Math), Essay writing, and interview so that they can apply for KMIDS Scholarships (Please refer to the announcement of KMIDS Admission Examination Guidelines)..
 - Please also note that all applicants are required to complete the school enrollment process with full payment of tuition fee prior to having a chance for Scholarship Acceptance.
